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## Summary:

This session forms part of a local study which looks at significant historical events, people and places in their own locality. It looks at the life of a family, who lived in the manor house. The costumed character led session helps pupils to understand the complexity of people's lives and the importance of roles within a household. The aim is to equip pupils to ask perceptive questions and weigh the evidence as well as to listen, understand and respond appropriately to others to extend their own ideas.

With activities run by museum educators in the morning and with teacher-led activities in the afternoon (supervised by a museum educator).
